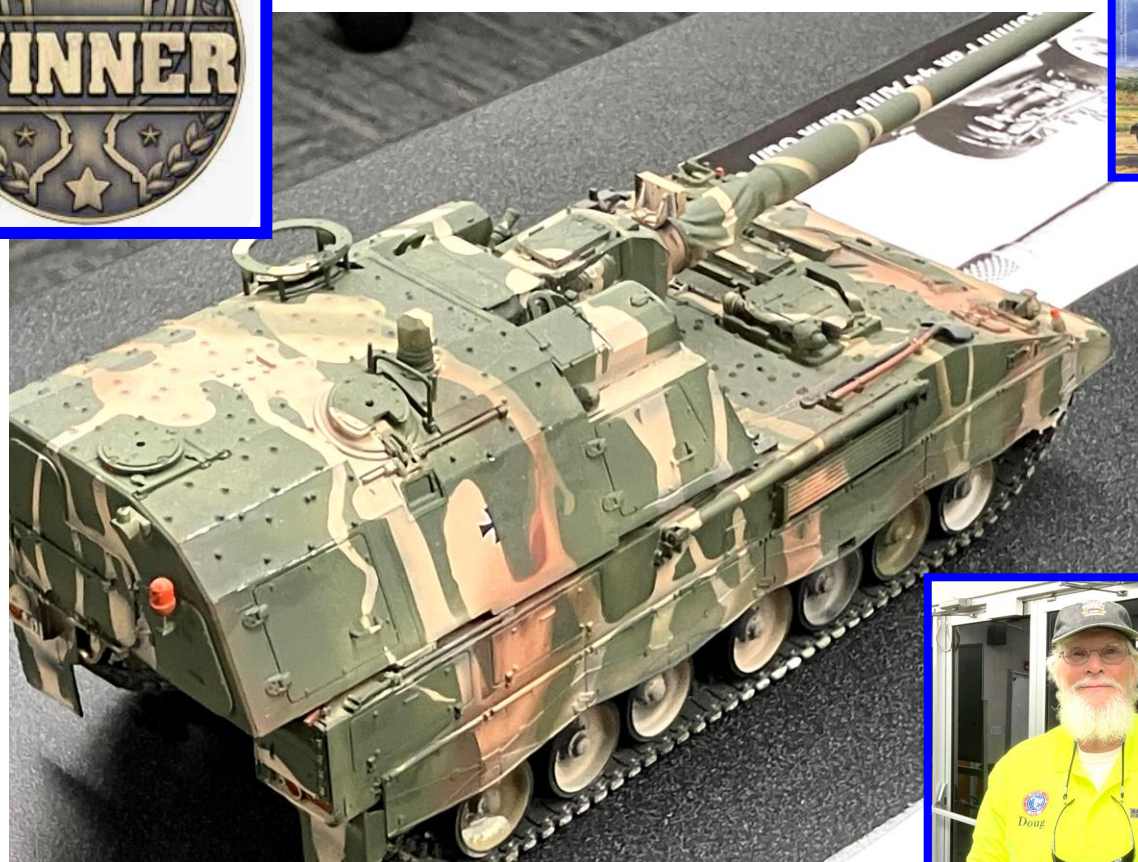

I picked up a roll of ribbon garland at Hobby Lobby. I thought it might make a nice mask for my resin tanks. This is a test piece.



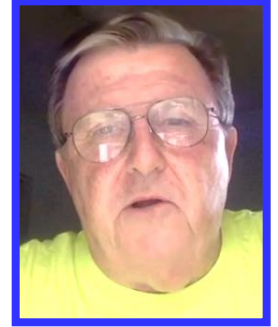
I might need to wrap it tighter, but I think it looks good, except for the thumb print.

President Doug Spinney called the meeting to order at 6:35pm. A total of 15 members were present.



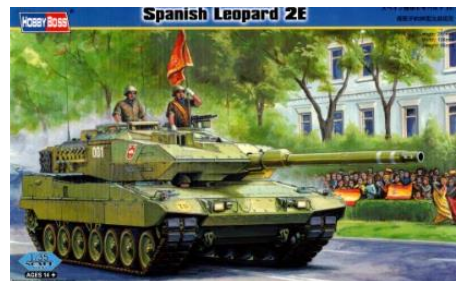
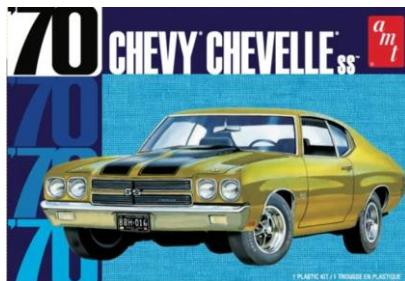
Upcoming events were discussed including Jaxcon on Feb. 6 & 7 and Scale Model Expo in the Villages April 11.

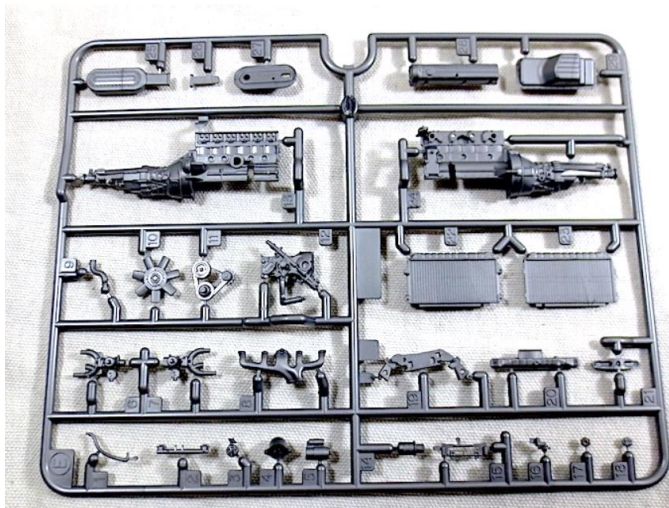

"Halo car" is a term used in the automotive industry to describe a car that elevates the reputation of a manufacturer, or, in this case, a whole country. Just as Germany needed a car like the Mercedes Gull-wing to symbolize its return to automotive excellence in the 1950's, the Japanese needed one in the early 1970's to assert their ability to produce a car with style and performance. Enter the Datsun 240Z. It revolutionized the way Americans thought about Japanese cars. It wasn't a boxy little economy sedan, but a real sports car with handling and power to match the world's best. This was a car I wanted but never owned. Better late than never.

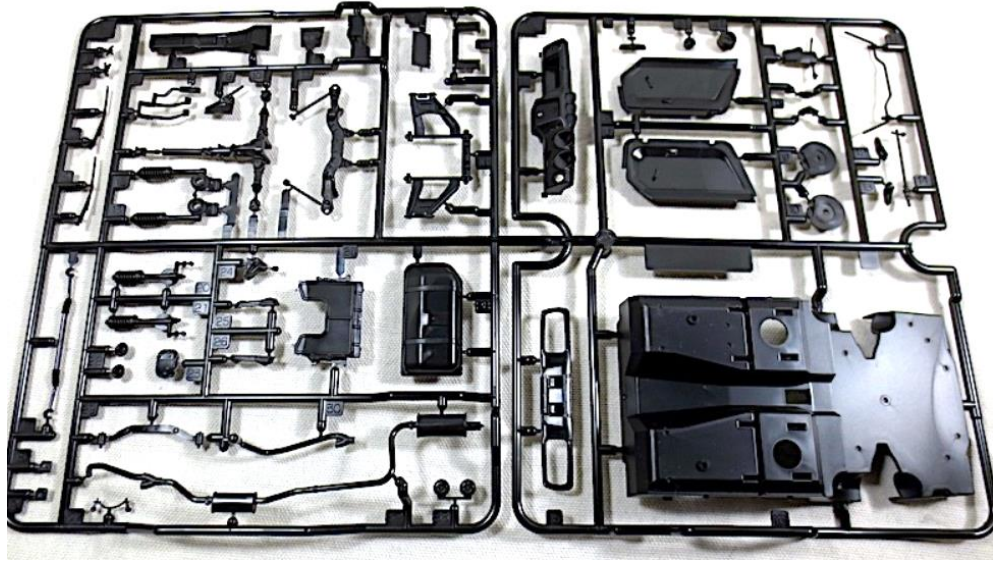


It stands to reason that the Japanese kit maker supreme, *Tamiya*, would pull out all the stops to make a model of this groundbreaking car. I recently purchased the kit, and this will be an *in-box* review of the contents. This is a big kit with lots of parts. The amount of detail in the engine and suspension is almost overwhelming. It makes you feel like you're building a real car.

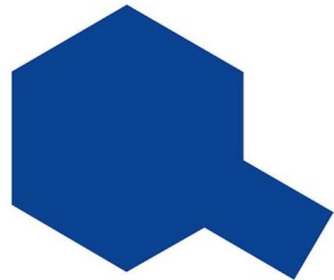
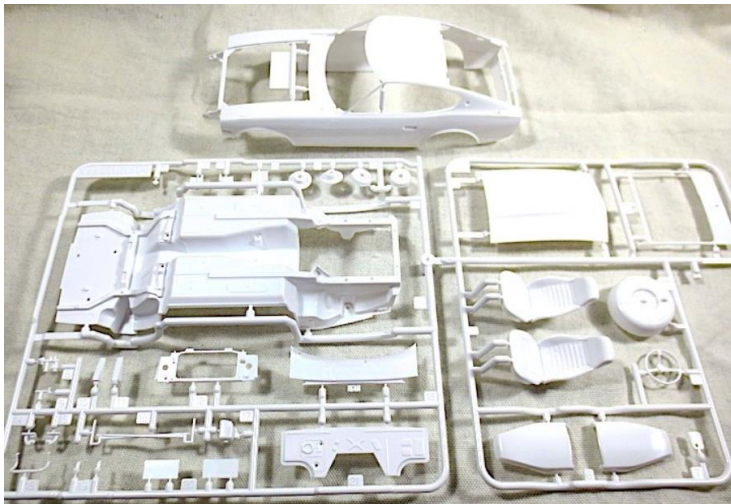

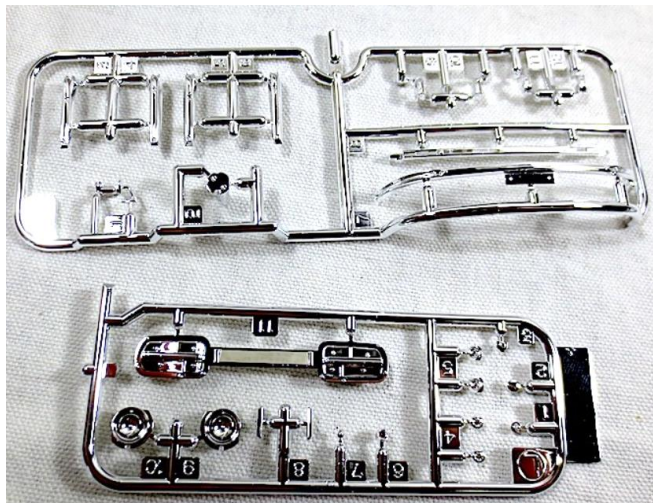
The engine sprue is well detailed and molded in the appropriate metallic gray color. Chassis and suspension are rendered in semi-gloss black, which makes painting unnecessary. I appreciate that.



The body and interior are presented in white. The suggested colors are blue or red for the exterior and

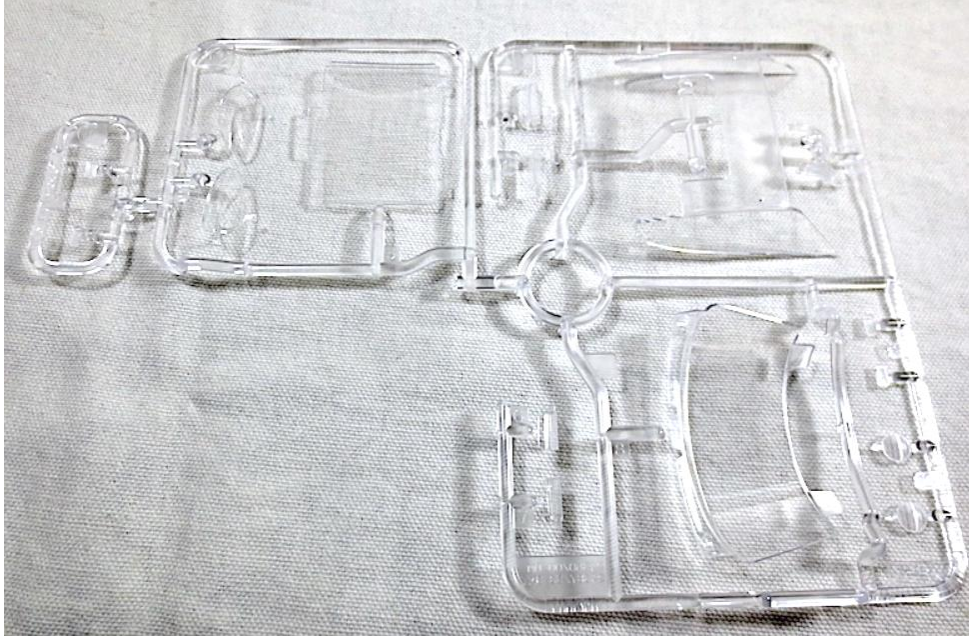


black for the interior. I plan to use the suggested exterior color of Tamiya Mica Blue. One complication is that parts for both left- and right-hand drive are provided. You have to make sure you don't mix them up like I did.

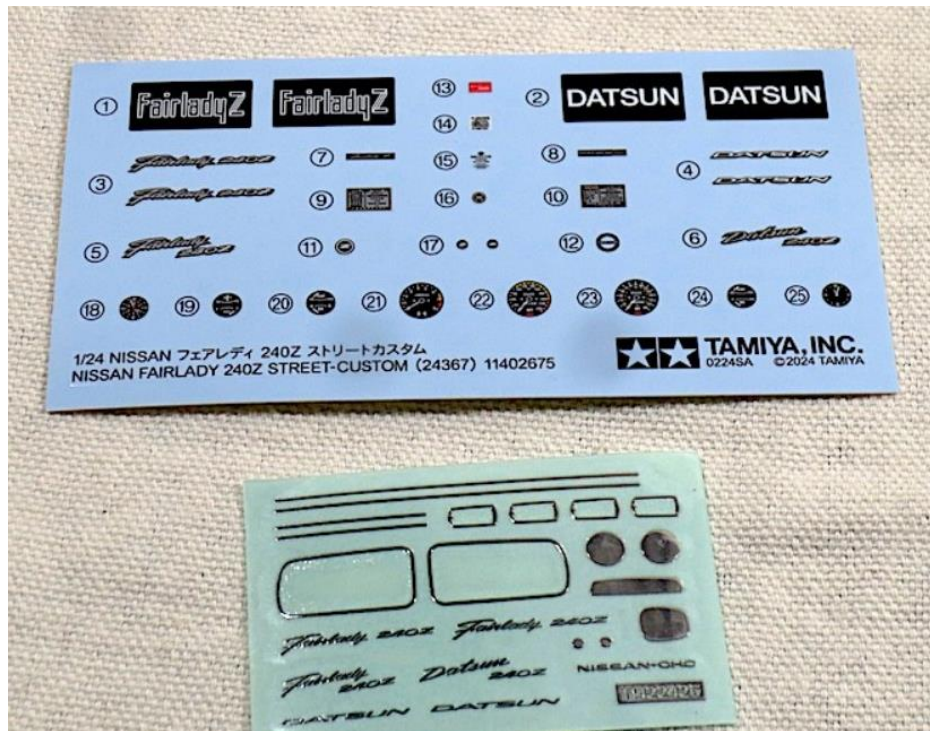

The biggest and most welcome surprise was the sprue containing chrome pieces to replicate the trim around the windows. Why hasn't anyone thought of this before?



The clear parts are beautifully done and include the gluing tabs Tamiya provides that make it possible to glue the windows without getting glue on the critical window surfaces.

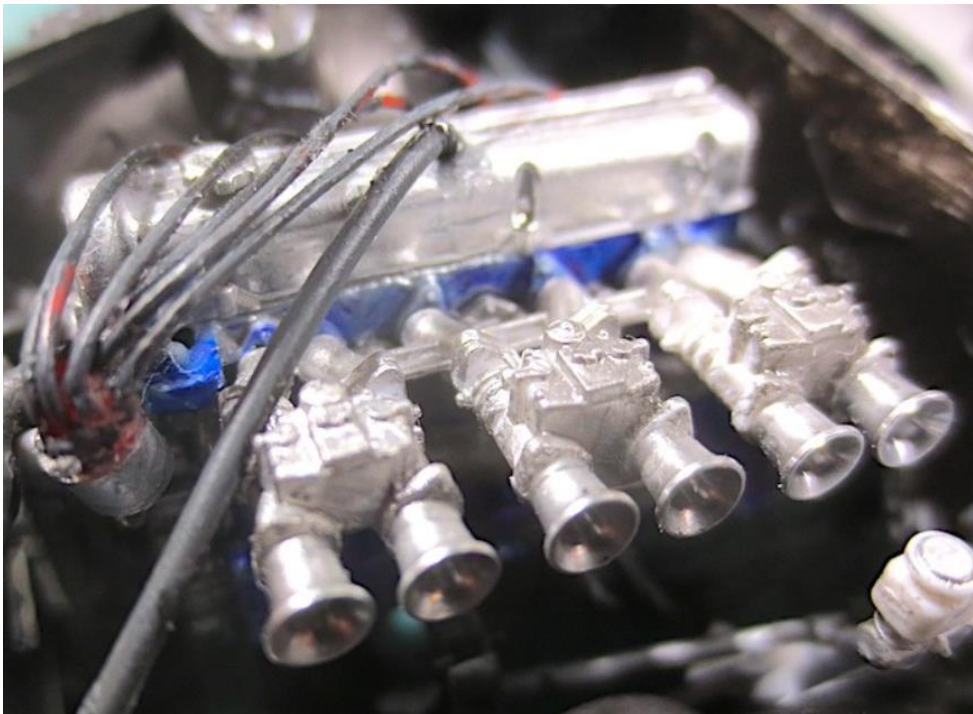

I also appreciate the decals for the instruments and the metal transfers that give the badges and mirrors added depth and realism. The older I get the less I like struggling with kits that don't reach the standard of this one. I don't mind spending a few more bucks to make my time on the workbench a pleasure rather than a pain.



So far, the build is going well. As I said earlier the level of detail is exceptional. Now comes the part I dread - painting. Hopefully, it will appear on the Show & Tell table in the near future. - [Frank](#)



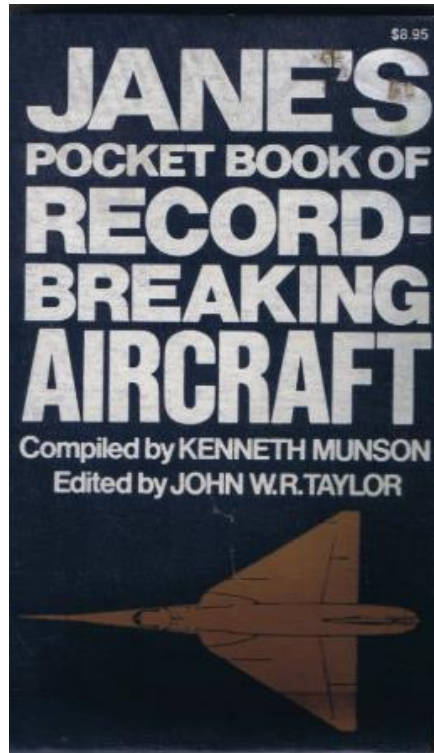

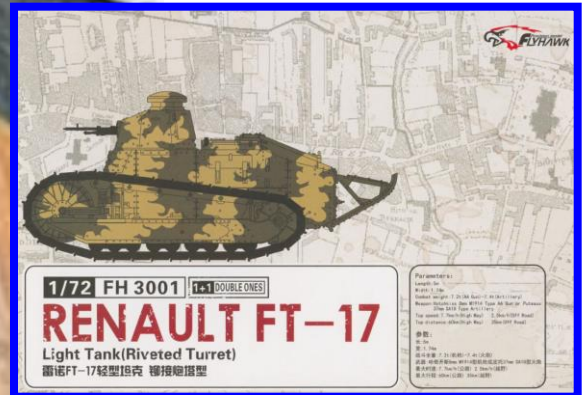

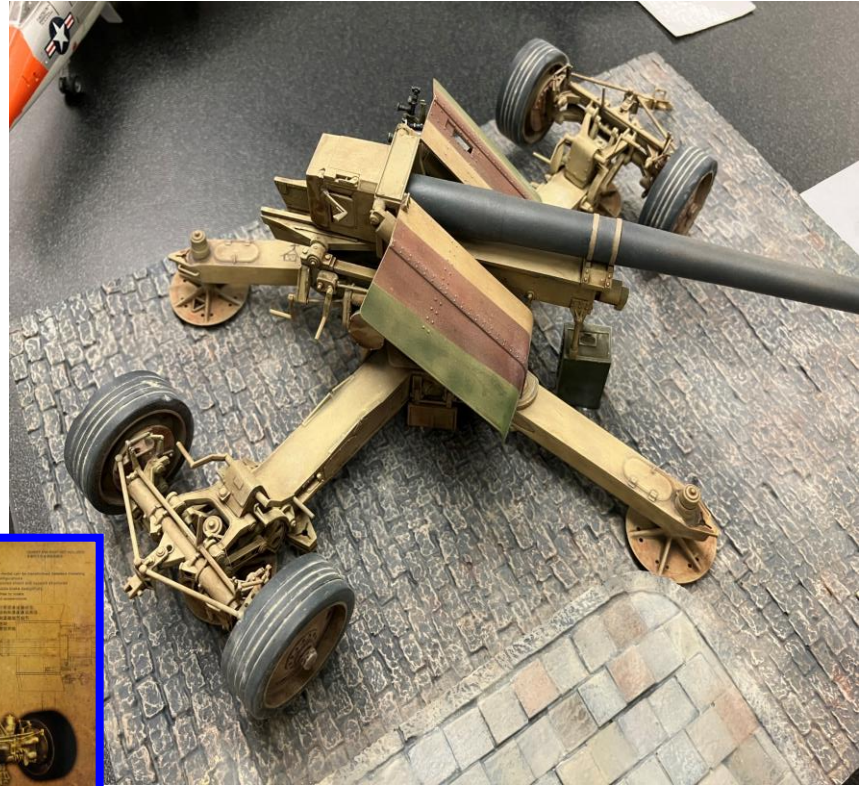

Theme for the 2026 Gainesville- Ocala Interclub contest: ICE WORLD

With the onset of massive global freezing, the polar ice caps extended south and north as far as 40th parallel and resulted in freezing solid Seattle's Puget Sound, New York's Hudson River and Ports, all of the Great Lakes, even northern sections of the Mediterranean Sea (ice bergs occasionally clogged the strait of Gibraltar).



In efforts to overcome the economic constraints of a frozen world, 'brilliant' minds diligently proposed various means of developing advantages out of difficulties, addressing issues of freighters, mass transits, recreation, and the military in a frozen world.

Let the Gainesville/Ocala IPMS club challenge propose solutions to this future problem in the form of a kit-bash of two (or more) kits of which at least one is plastic; use of other materials optional. Entry to be accompanied with a narrative of no more than 3 pages explaining the presentation. Judging will be based 2/3 on the model and 1/3 on the narrative. A new category is being introduced, a Junior Class for entrants 18 years of age or younger. Judging to be done by entry members.

TBD. Contest dates being targeted (depending on availability of a meeting place) are, first choice, Saturday 25th of April 2026 or second choice, Saturday 11th of April 2026.

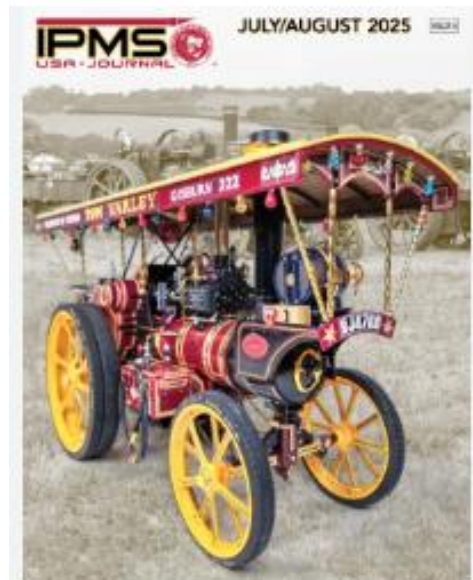

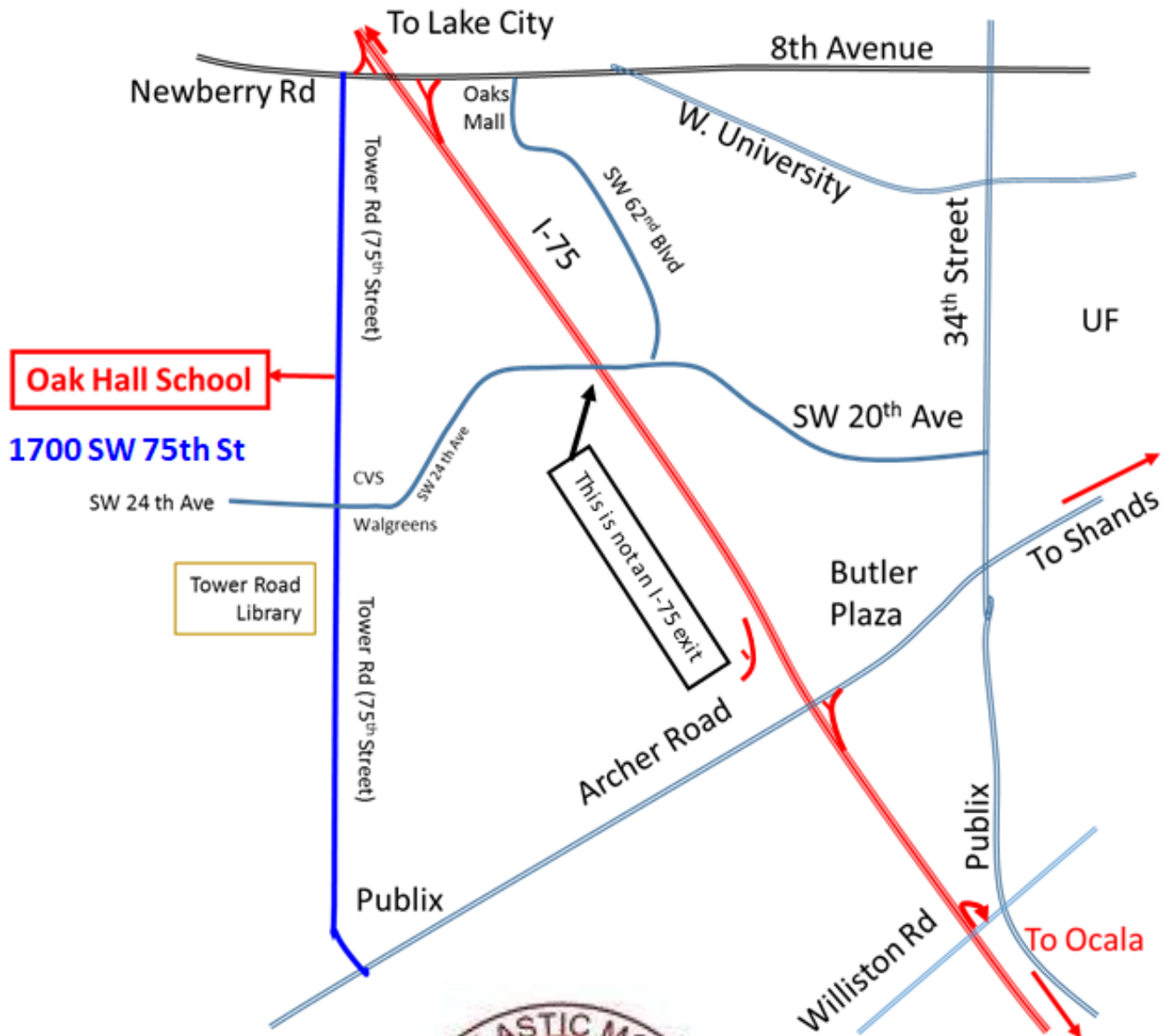

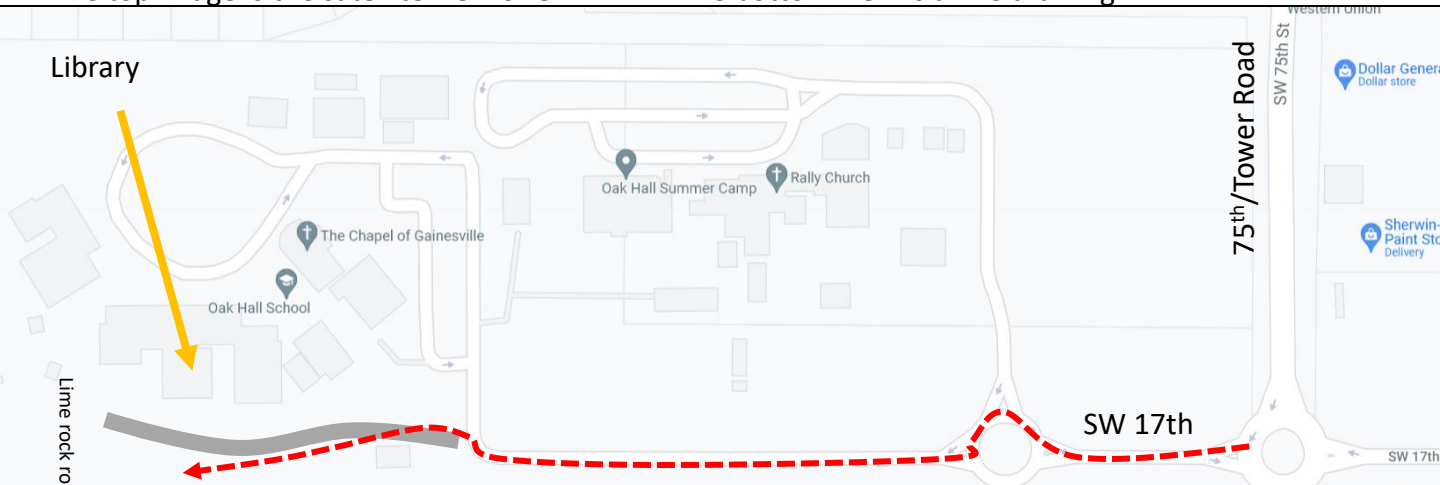

The top image is the satellite view of OAK HALL. The bottom view is a line drawing.

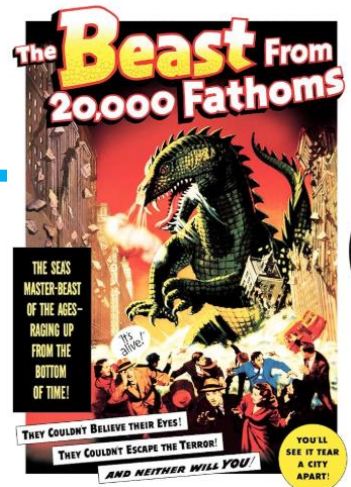
