
Gettysburg

My summer "Bucket List" adventures continued this year with a long-awaited trip to the battlefield of Gettysburg. You don't have to be a history buff to understand the importance of this epic battle that sealed the fate of the Confederate forces and preserved the Union.



Military historians have debated over the years how the brilliant and resourceful Confederate General Robert E. Lee could have ordered the suicidal Pickett's Charge on the 3rd day of the battle.





Most analysts agree that Lee (above left) underestimated the abilities of his Union adversaries - General George Meade (above right) and his troops.

Gettysburg



You can't overestimate the importance of Gettysburg to the future of the United States. President Lincoln framed it as the ultimate test of whether democracy could survive as a form of government.



War was waged very differently in those days. Weaponry was primitive. Masses of troops were moved like pieces on a chessboard and casualties were enormous.



I wanted to build something to memorialize my visit but most Civil War kits focus on dioramas of soldiers.



Gettysburg

Since painting figures is not my cup of tea I decided to get a kit of the most famous cannon of the war - the Parrott Rifle.



It was a 10 pounder cannon that was designed by a Union Army officer named Parrott to fix the problem of overheating that caused other cannons to crack or explode.

You see these cannons all over the Gettysburg battlefield and I am hoping that someday soon it will be a nice bookend in my library.



We remember Bruce Doyle's father *Lt. George Edward Doyle* who gave his life for our freedom.


Lt. Doyle was born 20 December 1919 in Hanover, Grafton County, New Hampshire. He served as a First Lieutenant and bombardier on B-25J #43-27807, 11th Bomber Squadron, 341st Bomber Group, U.S. Army Air Force during World War II. He was "Killed In Action" on 20 June 1945 at age 25 when his B-25 crashed during a bombing run in IndoChina (Vietnam). He was awarded the Air Medal and the Purple Heart.




